The Chronicle has been slightly delayed this month as I was waiting for the announcement of the end of fire restrictions. At this stage fire restrictions are still in place, and the listed date is 1st May for their cessation. We will notify the town via our Facebook page and notices on the community information noticeboard if the date changes.

With the end of daylight savings, change your clock, change your smoke alarm battery. If you need help changing your batteries please let a brigade member know, we are happy to help.

We recommend that chimneys are checked prior to lighting them as the weather gets cooler.



Community feedback required on Wellington Shire's Road Management Plan

Wellington Shire Council maintains a very extensive public road network of approximately 3,100km in length, and our Road Management Plan establishes processes and sets standards in relation to the inspection, maintenance and repair of roads and paths for which Council is responsible.

Council is currently reviewing the Road Management Plan 2013 to ensure that the standards and priorities that we are responsible for, as required under the *Road Management Act 2004*, are relevant and appropriate.

There are also many roads throughout the municipality that are not currently maintained, as they are not required for use by the general public. The Road Management Plan 2013 contains criteria to assess a road will or will not be maintained Council. These criteria have been a focus of the current review for 2017. A copy of the current Road Management Plan 2013 and draft Road Management Plan 2017, is available at

www.wellington.vic.gov.au/roadmanagementplan. Hard copies of both documents are also available to view at Customer Service Centres in Sale and Yarram.

Comments and feedback on the draft Road Management Plan 2017 can be made through a submission. All submissions must be received by Sunday 30 April 2017. Please ensure that your submission:

- Clearly identifies the document name
- Sets out your views on the content of the document
- Sets out the changes that you would like to see in the document, if any
- Contains your contact details - including postal address (Name and contact details of submitters are required for Council to consider the submissions and to notify people of the next steps in the process).
