Clearly, the most significant celebration at St Brigid's during April will be Easter. Holy Week, Good Friday and Easter Sunday mark significant events encountered by Jesus during the traumatic journey to his death and Resurrection. At the personal level, the resurrection has particular significance for each of us. For as Paul declares 'if Christ has not been raised then our preaching is useless and your believing is useless' (1Cor 15:14). So among other things, Easter shines a bright light on our faith. For we all have to believe in something in order to make any sense of our lives. Yet, is our faith useless? We can get it wrong. For example, Paul himself was a ferocious persecutor of Jesus' followers; but, in time, he became one of Jesus' most effective disciples. So Easter provides us with much food for thought. Not the least is the encouragement to reflect on what it is that I believe? And is it useful

Wellington women encouraged to get active and have fun

Women in Wellington are invited to get active and empowered with the launch of This Girl Can in Sale. Wellington Shire Council is teaming with VicHealth and GippSport to provide a heap of opportunities for women in our community to start moving and have some fun.

The launch event will take place at Aqua Energy on Saturday 6 April, with the opportunity to try a free session of stand-up paddle boarding and/or free flow yoga after a formal launch and morning tea.

There will also be a calendar of further events launched, which will include women's basketball, yoga, gymnastics and a range of aquatic activities to take place throughout April and early May.

The This Girl Can campaign features everyday Victorian women instead of professional athletes or airbrushed Instagram models and is about empowering women to feel comfortable in their bodies and in public spaces – regardless of their ability, how they look or how sweaty they get.

"This Girl Can – Victoria has had real success in building a supportive community of women who encourage each other to get out there and get active," Wellington Shire Council Mayor Alan Hall said.

“There’ll be a range of free, fun and inclusive activities provided on the day that will help women take that first and often daunting step to being active.

“From that day we hope to offer further activities for local women and create sustainable programs that can allow for ongoing participation.”

GippSport chief executive Daniel Poynton said the This Girl Can campaign had been promoted through the localised Gippy Girls Can spin off.

“To be able to align to a state-wide campaign is great for Wellington and will empower more woman to get active,” he said.

VicHealth CEO Jerril Rechter said This Girl Can was about empowering everyday women to get active in their local community without feeling judged.

“We want all women – no matter how sweaty they get, how red their face is or how good they are – to feel comfortable about getting out there and giving physical activity a go,” she said.

“That’s what *This Girl Can – Victoria* is all about.”

Wellington Shire Council is looking for deserving rural women in our community who need or would love a day out!

As part of the work we are doing with drought affected communities, Council in partnership with Lardner Park and the Rotary Club of Sale have passes for the Women in Ag Luncheon at Farm World up for grabs.

Council is seeking women in Wellington to nominate a friend from a drought affected community who is deserving of a day out, for the chance of both of them to win a free day out.

“We have passes for 23 women and their chosen friend to catch a bus from Sale and attend the event, which is held on the first day of Farm World, Thursday 11 April at Lardner Park,” Wellington Mayor Alan Hall said.

“This is a great opportunity for rural women to nominate female friends who could do with a break from the farm and enjoy a day out.

“There is no need to worry about a thing, as long as you are available on that day and can make your way to Sale to catch the bus, everything else will be taken care of.”

The passes are valued at more than \$100 each and include entry to Farm World, the luncheon, entertainment, champagne on arrival, a gift bag to take home, return transport to and from Lardner Park from Sale.

Inspiring guest speakers at the event include Melissa Connors from The Farmer Needs a Farmer, Amy Paul from Ruby Hill Organics and Claire Templeton from Square Mile Meats.

Nominations can be made via Council’s Facebook page. Those who don’t have access to Facebook are encouraged to ask a friend who does to assist.

Applications close midday on Friday, 5 April.




